The average bath uses 80 litres of water, a shower about half that – maybe keep the baths for special occasions.

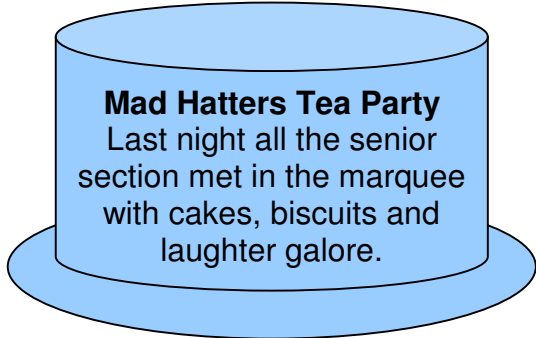
Kitchen Mishaps, When trangia's fight back-By Emily Southall
